Missing Crown Jewels

Few joys can match the pleasure gained from acquiring a plant that is new to you and all of your friends. It happens far too seldom, but those novel plants are still waiting to be collected by those adventurous plant collectors. A few examples might encourage their introduction.

If you're into *Begonias*, this will get your juices flowing. Deep in the Malaysian rainforest Mary Sizemore and I found a Begonia, *Begonia pavonina*, with leaves that were as blue as any Morpho butterfly's wing. While it is not an easy grower it really merits the attention it demands. While it is rare, it is occasionally available. Good luck.

Another gem, also from Malaysia, Koto Tinggi, is an absurdly attractive *Commelinaceae*, I believe the genus to be, *Forrestia*. This is a plant resembling a modest sized Dracaena but the leaf surface sets it apart from most other plants. The surface has the texture of sear-sucker and to add to its attractiveness the bottom of the leaf is bright purple.

There are thousands of plants yet in the wild that could grace our collections if only an adventuresome soul would collect them. Anyone for Asia?
